

One small step for turkey.

Your print, cut & disguise kit. A little imagination does the rest.

1 Print at actual size

Use LETTER paper and the 100% / Actual Size setting.
Turn off Fit to Page. Print pages 2 and 3.
Check the ruler below before you start.

2 Make it yours

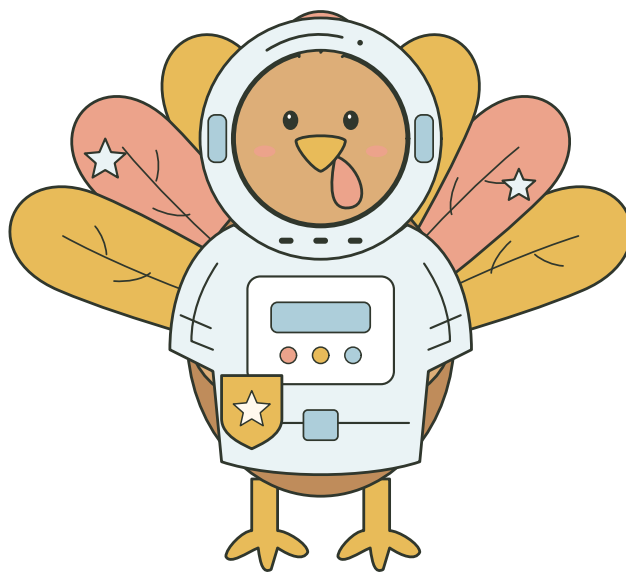
If using the color-in kit, color before cutting.
Crayons, pencils or markers all work.

3 Cut the pieces

Cut around the outside of the turkey and costume.
A grown-up cuts out the helmet's inner circle.
Solid outer lines are your cutting guides.

4 Suit up

Glue the suit over the body; keep the feet showing.
Center the helmet window around the face.
Add the badge and stars wherever you like.



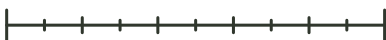
READY FOR LIFT-OFF

A tiny supply list

Paper / Printer / Scissors / Glue stick / Coloring supplies (optional)

An adult should help with scissors and the inside of the helmet.

PRINT CHECK



This line must measure 50 mm.

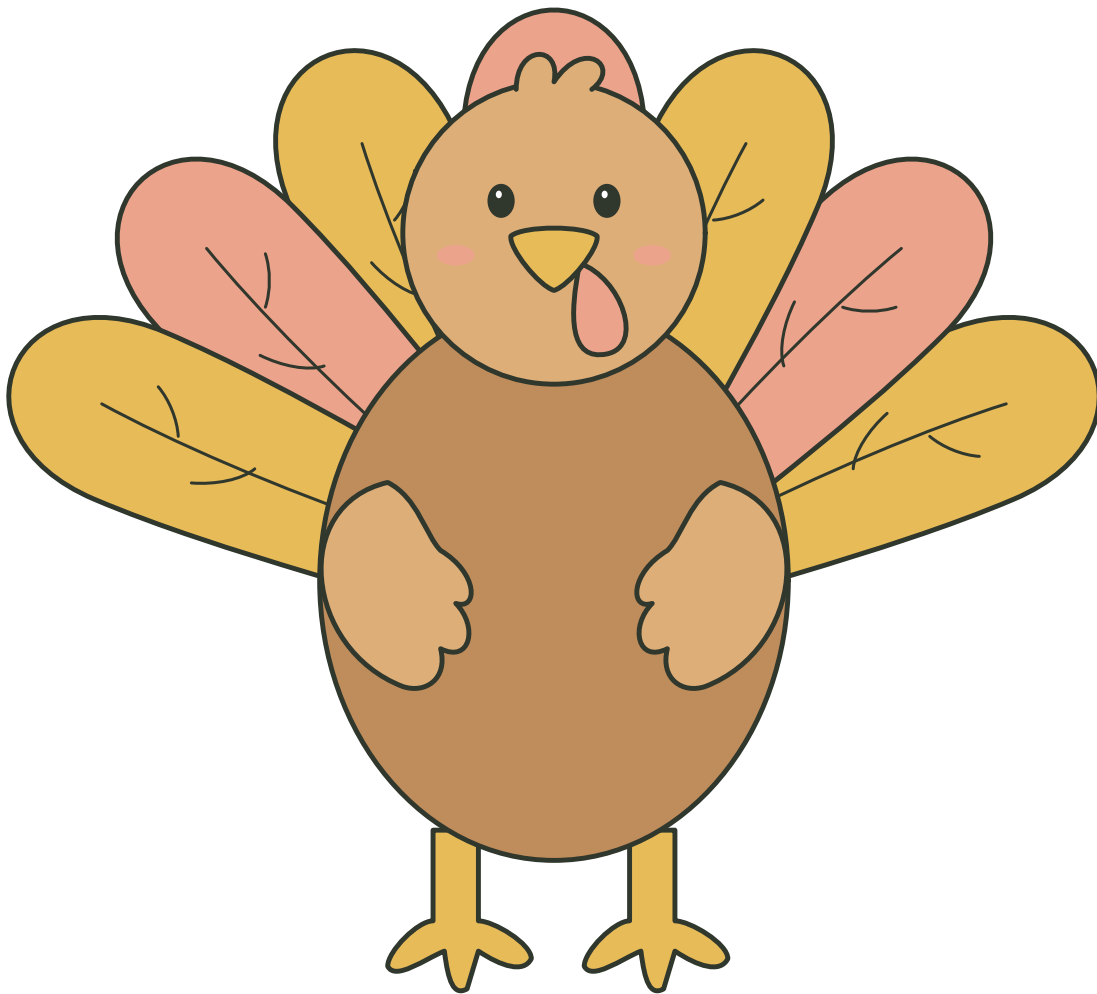
One kit. Two paper sizes.

Use the same paper size for every page.

The costume fits this turkey base only.

Meet your undercover turkey.

Color if you like, then cut around the outside. Keep the face and feathers together.



TURKEY BASE / 100% ACTUAL SIZE

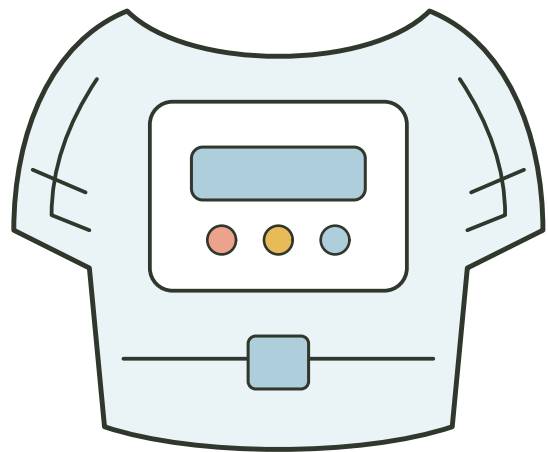
Print this page and the costume page at the same scale.

Every turkey needs a space suit.

Cut out the suit, helmet, badge and stars. Glue them onto the turkey on page 2.

02 SUIT

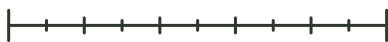


03 MISSION BADGE

PRINT CHECK



This line must measure 50 mm.

Tip: try the pieces before gluing.

The helmet window sits around the turkey's face.
